
Summer Reading 2019-20

The Written Assignment is due the first week of class. On the first day of school, I will tell you which day to turn in your responses and to bring in your object.

Written Assignment

In order to prove you have read and understood the story, you will prepare a written response consisting of 3 paragraphs and 3 questions.

Paragraph 1: Write a plot summary of the novel. Make sure to cover the beginning, middle, & end!

Paragraph 2: In what ways can you relate to the novel? Consider the setting, Nicole's experience, Natty's experience, etc.

Paragraph 3: What is your own personal ragdoll (a symbol of hope, change, or new beginnings)? Be prepared to bring this object or a photograph of the object to class!

3 Questions: If you got a chance to meet the author, what 3 questions would you ask?

Throughout your sophomore year, we will work on developing your writing skills. But REMEMBER, all paragraphs have topic sentences, evidence, explanations, transitions, and conclusions. I will be looking for these things in your writing! Make sure to PROOFREAD!
